Entrants: Varsity teams may enter 7 runners maximum. JV teams may have unlimited entries. Please be sure all JV/V athletes are listed on the team eligibility roster on the website of the Minnesota State High School League **Entries are due at RaceberryJaM.com by 6:00 p.m. Thursday, October 15, 2009.** Please remove any runners from your roster that will NOT be competing so we do not pay for extra timing chips.

Scoring: Electronic chip timing, placing, and scoring will be provided by Jack Moran and RaceberryJaM.

Chips will be available in each team's meet packet on race day by 3:00 p.m. There will be 1 chip per runner to be laced into a single shoe. An official video camera will be used at the entrance to the finish corral to resolve any potential issues with the timing due to the single chip being used. Runners will wear an assigned number on the front of their uniform which coaches will receive at check-in. Please be sure that runners wear the correct number. Pins will be provided.

Chips are to be returned by team and gender to the finish area prior to the awards ceremony. Schools will be charged \$10 per chip for any not returned the day of the meet.

Games The Games Committee/Jury of Appeals this season includes the coaches from Mahtomedi, Committee: North, and South St. Paul High Schools. Greg Utecht will serve on these groups as well. The meet starter will serve as referee.

Trainer: A certified trainer from the Institute for Athletic Medicine will be on-site on race day beginning at 1:30 p.m.

Uniforms/ Jewelry, etc.: Refer to your copy of the 2009 rules as well as interpretations published by MSHSL for relevant information. Officials do not have the authority to disregard rules and this is not an area the Games Committee has within its jurisdiction. Coaches are responsible for knowing the rules and helping their athletes adhere to them. Please note the interpretation from the national federation banning watches with GPS capability.

Electronic Devices: Rules prohibit the use of electronic devices in competition areas. These refer to athletes, coaches, officials, spectators, and so on. The competition area is really the entire site except for team campsites. Please be sure you and your athletes do not have cell phones, iPods, and so on anywhere near the race course, starting areas, finish areas, or competitors at all times (this includes warm-ups, etc.)

Race Day Coaches' Meeting: There will be a brief coaches meeting for last minute information at the **FINISH** area at 2:00 p.m.

Parking: Parking requires the purchase of a daily or seasonal pass from the park. Please inform your parents and spectators of this so they have the funds necessary to enter the park

The conference will pay for your team bus – just stop at the gate and let them know your school's name so we keep track. Drop your athletes at the team camp area, then send the bus around the finish area to the parking area along the roadway west of the start.

Pets: Although the park is pet-friendly, there have been incidents with loose animals at other cross country races in the area. We would ask you to encourage your spectators to leave their pets at home.

Course Maps: Course maps have been drawn showing modifications in the traditional course layouts. These were done in consultation with Jim Beecroft, longtime meet manager, after meeting with coaches this summer. The finish corral area will be the same for boys and girls. They will enter the corral on finish lines that are 90° apart. This will have the girls run a longer area at the finish and a shorter area at the start of the race. The boys will have a slightly different final curve by the parking lot.

The courses have been re-wheeled and the 1, 2, & 3 mile marks for each race distance will be marked. A race official will be at these locations reading split times for all runners.
